

OPPORTUNITY FOR RECONSIDERATION OF:

- (a) HAP Major Boiler MACT Standards
- (b) MACT Standards for Small Boilers
- (c) Definition of Solid Waste Used as a Fuel
- (d) NSPS Standards for Solid Waste Incinerators

On the same day the four final rules above are published, EPA will publish a 60-day opportunity for submittal of information for the Agency to reconsider the final standards.

The issues available for reconsideration and comment are:

1. Revisions to the proposed subcategories in the major source boilers rule;
2. Establishment of a fuel specification in the major source boilers rule through which gas-fired boilers that use a fuel other than natural gas may be considered Gas 1 units;
3. Establishing work practice standards for limited use major source boilers;
4. Establishment of standards for biomass and oil-fired area source boilers based on generally available control technology;
5. Revision of the proposed subcategory for energy recovery units for CISWI units;
6. Establishment of limitations on fuel switching provisions for CISWI units;
7. Revision to the proposed definition of CISWI to exclude cyclonic burn barrels;
8. Providing an affirmative defense for malfunction events for major and area source boilers and for CISWI units;
9. Revisions to the proposed monitoring requirements for carbon monoxide for major source boilers and for CISWI units;
10. Revisions to the proposed dioxin emission limit and testing requirement for major source boilers;
11. Establishing a full-load stack test requirement for carbon monoxide coupled with continuous oxygen monitoring for major source boilers and CISWI units;
12. Establishing a definition of "homogenous waste" in the CISWI rule;
13. Setting PM standards under generally available control technology for oil-fired area source boilers; and
14. Certain findings regarding the applicability of Title V permitting requirements for area source boilers.
