Laboratory Reporting	Hospitals performing lab tests for active COVID-19 infection	All positive & negative lab results must be reported, for PCR and antigen/point-of-care tests. Must include the facility name, ordering provider name, full patient demographics (to include patient name, DOB, Sex, Race, Address and Phone number), test name and result and specimen collection date. This fulfills federal lab reporting requirements.	ADH	Three options (choose one): 1) Electronic feed 2) Point-of-Care Reporting Portal (can be used for all types of tests) 3) Fax (not preferred)
Communicable Disease Reporting	Hospitals identifying any COVID-19 patients	The standard Arkansas communicable disease reporting process includes SARS-CoV-2 as a reportable disease. Per ADH, if your facility has already provided a lab report on the patient, that lab report fulfills this requirement. Hospitalized Patient Information via RedCAP	Hospitals treating patients for COVID-19	Patient-level information submitted in an Excel file via the ADH RedCAP link. (Psychiatric hospitals with COVID-19 patients need not report, unless they are treating those patients specifically for COVID-19.)	ADH	https://adhredcap.arkansas.gov/redcap/surveys/?s=KCEDPF DT7L

EMResource / HAvBED	Hospitals with EMResource accounts	Hospital-level information on availability, utilization, and capacity. COVID-19 data should be updated twice daily.	ADH	https://emresource.juvare.com/login
TeleTracking / HHS Protect	Hospitals	Hospital-level information on utilization and capacity. Psych and rehab hospitals must report once weekly, other hospitals must report all required elements for each day. Submission is a Medicare Condition of Participation.
